CABOOLTURE GOLF CLUB

GENERAL CONDITIONS OF PLAY.

The Match Committee/Club Professional of Caboolture Golf Club reserves the right to make all arrangements, to fix and/or alter starting times, to change handicap limits, alter the number of Divisions in any event, or in the case of insufficient entries, cancel any event.

It is the responsibility of each individual player to read and be familiar with the Local Rules board and the Rules of Golf. I didn't know is not an excuse.

All competition payouts will be in accordance as per trophy distribution guidelines.

Honour Board event payouts will be Winner \$100, Runners-up \$60 to be awarded at the Annual Presentation Night.

MOBILE PHONES:

The use of a mobile phone by a competitor whilst on the golf course during an event is distracting and inconsiderate. If the competitor is in the possession of a mobile it should be turned off. If the phone rings this is deemed to be in use and the Committee may take disciplinary action against the offending player. If the phone has a distance measuring device it may be used, however the ring must be turned off. In match play, the opponent should be informed if the player plans to use their phone as a measuring device only.

SUSPENSION OF PLAY:

A suspension in a dangerous situation will be signalled by one prolonged air-horn note. All practice areas and course areas are closed during suspension in a dangerous situation (e.g. lightning) until the Committee has declared them open.

RETURN OF CARDS:

All competition cards must be returned for handicapping. All scorecards must be complete and entered on the computer kiosks provided and placed in the competition results box no later than 15 minutes on completion of play. It is the players responsibility to ensure their name, membership (Golf link number for visitors) and handicap are show on their scorecard.

MEMBERSHIP FEES/COMPETITION FEES/VISITORS:

Members who are not financial are not eligible to play in competitions. Before teeing off all players are required to pay competition fees as set by club, 15 minutes before tee time. Visitors may play in Club competitions if they can provide proof of their club membership and proof of handicap, visitors are also subject to the Conditions of Play set for each individual competition at Caboolture Golf Club.

PROTESTS AND DISPUTES:

All protests and disputes must be in writing and submitted to the Match Committee upon completion of play. The Match Committee's decision in all competitions will be final. It is the duty of every member to bring to the notice of the committee any infringements of the Rules and Etiquette of Golf.

DRESS REQUIREMENTS FOR EVERYONE:

Members and Visitors are required to be suitably dressed in accordance to the dress code set by the Caboolture Golf Club and within the set guidelines of sun safety and workplace health and safety, both on the Course and in the Club House.

MEN'S ECLECTIC:

All members will be automatically included in the Eclectic competition that will only be conducted on Monthly Medal days from December to November. Nett scores using half current handicap will count for ball distribution at the end of the year. NOTE: Completed cards only qualify for the eclectic competition.

LADIES ECLECTIC:

All single rounds only played on Thursday, Saturday and Sunday, commencing 1st February and finishing on Saturday 3rd November. On the final day of this competition, half current handicap will be deducted from the total 18-hole scores to determine the winners and runners up

EAGLES NEST:

The Eagles Nest is a Members only payout. All Eagles recorded will receive 25% of the pool of the day. Any visitors who have an Eagle will receive 2 balls or equivalent loyalty points (1000 points).

SILVER CIRCLE: MEMBERS ONLY

A Silver Circle is any NTP 45cm or less on par 3's. All silver Circle's will receive 20% of the pool of the day and if there is two or more on any particular hole then the nearest measurement will receive the NTP ball allocation as well.

SOCIAL CLUB VISITORS:

Social Club Members who hold a G.A Handicap will be eligible to play in competitions at Caboolture Golf Club, however they cannot win. They will be eligible for runner up, NTP and Ball rundown. Competition Fees for these Social players will be determined by the Board and Officials of the club.

JUNIORS IN CARTS:

Juniors can ride in carts; however, they cannot drive them. They must have a minimum Red P plate or be 18 years of age. Disciplinary action for this will be 2 warning from Match either verbal or Written, if this action continues the matter will be passed to the Board.

Please Remember your Match Committee are members too. Please bring your issues to them AFTER they have completed their game.

WEDNESDAY MONTHLY CHALLENGE

CONDITIONS OF PLAY.

GAME: Open Single Stroke.

FEES: Normal competition fees apply.

1. The event will be conducted in accordance within the Rules of Golf and any Local Rules as displayed on the local rule board outside the Pro Shop on the day of play.
2. The challenge will be played on a Wednesday of each month and will be open to all Members and Visitors who have a current G.A handicap.
3. The main trophy of this event is the Best Nett of the Day in each grade. All players are eligible to win these prizes. The winning players can be members or visitors, and either males or females.
4. If a visitor wins the A, B or C Grade Nett prize, then the next best visitor will be awarded the best visitor prize of the day.
5. Prizes can change owing to the number of players in the field and weather conditions.
6. **FINALS:** The Wednesday Monthly Challenge Final will be held each July.
7. Players eligible to compete in the Challenge Final are Best Nett winner
Best Visitor Nett winner
Runner up Nett winner
Best Gross winner
8. Each player is only entitled to one prize except in the Challenge Final. Players qualifying throughout the year for the Final and play in the Challenge Final are eligible to win the Final or Runner- up Final prize and daily prizes in the July Challenge competition.
9. A list of finalists will be posted in the Pro Shop and the Club web site after the June Challenge is complete. Winning visitors will be notified through their home club where possible.

1. The event will be conducted in accordance to the Rules of Golf and any Local Rules as displayed on the Local Rules Board.
2. Players to report to the Proshop 15 minutes prior to their allotted tee time. Failure to do so may result in a penalty imposed by the Match Committee. – Rule No 5.3(a)
3. Normal Competition Fees apply.
4. Men will tee off from the **WHITE** markers.
5. Ladies will tee off from the **RED** markers.
6. Completed cards must be in the hands of the Match Committee 15 minutes after the completion of the round on the day. Any card not presented will be considered an NCR, the Match Committee will not be held responsible for any such cards. Match Committee will settle any disputes or protests, which must be in writing and submitted within 15 minutes of completion of the days play. Rule 20.2(b).
7. Reduced handicaps will apply.
8. The Stroke play game will be in the Grades indicated below:

CLUB CHAMPIONSHIPS

STROKE CHAMPIONSHIPS (MEN'S AND LADIES)

The Championships of Caboolture Golf Club will be played over 72 holes (4x18 hole rounds) on Saturday 4th May 2019

Saturday 11th May 2019

Saturday 18th May 2019

Saturday 25th May 2019

To be eligible for the championship's players must be FULL financial members for the duration of the event, hold a current G.A handicap and have paid the daily competition fee that the board has set for the competition.

Normal booking applies subject to availability, except for the last round where seeded draw applies.

CONDITIONS OF PLAY

1. The event will be conducted in accordance to the Rules of Golf and any Local Rules as displayed on the Local Rules Board.
2. PLAYERS are to report to the STARTER 15 minutes prior to their tee time. Failure to do so could result in a penalty imposed by the Match Committee – Rule No 5.3(a)
3. PRACTICE between competition rounds on consecutive days is NOT permitted.
4. COMPLETED CARDS must be in the hands of the Match Committee 15 minutes after the completion of the round. These shall be treated as a completed round and no changes may be made to scores or cards. Any card not found (Paper or in the mi club system) will be considered an NCR. The Committee will settle any disputes or protests, which must be in writing and submitted within 15 minutes of the completion of that day's play. Disputes and decisions shall be governed by the Rule 20.2(b)
5. The CHAMPIONSHIPS will be conducted over 72 holes of Stroke Play in Grades as indicated below:

MEN	A GRADE 0-13	B GRADE 14-19	C GRADE 20-36
LADIES	A GRADE 0-18	B GARDE 19-29	C GRADE 30-45

SENIOR is any player who had attained the age of 50 years prior to 1st January of that year

JUNIOR is any player who has not attained the age of 18 years on or prior to the start of the Championships.

6. Ball rundown will be graded in each round for the men and the ladies.
7. Final ranking after 4 rounds will be based on first round handicap, no reduction will apply. Daily rounds and daily competitions will involve handicap reduction.
8. Men will tee off from the **BLUE** markers.
Ladies will tee off from the **RED** markers.
9. The **CHAMPIONSHIP WINNER** in each category will be the player in that category with the lowest aggregate gross score.
10. **TIES:** In the event of a tie in the gross events there will be a 3-hole play-off using the aggregate score of holes 10,11 and 18. If there is still a tie a sudden death playoff will continue using the same holes. In the event of a tie in all other events, a count back shall be continued according to the Rules of Golf.
11. **SEEDED DRAW** will apply for the final round for the 8 (4 for Ladies) best gross scores in each grade at the discretion of the Match Committee. Any player included in the seeded draw must play at the time decided by the Match Committee to be eligible to win Gross champion. **If the seeded player does not play at that time they cannot win the Gross champion or Runner-up prize or qualify for the Match Play Championship event.** They are still eligible for the Nett Championship event.
12. **MATCH PLAY** for the men will proceed for the top 8 players in each Grade as Programmed. In the event of a player not being able to compete in ALL rounds of the Men's Match Play the Match Committee will substitute the next lowest gross score from the Club Championships to fill the Vacancy or Vacancies. The Match Play Matches can be played on or before the Fixture date if agreed by both players, but all results must be finalised by the posted date. Seeded players will be required to put a Q or NQ on their card on the final round of the Championships to show their interest in playing in the Match Play Competition.

13. **PRESENTATIONS**

- A. The Club Champions and Runner-ups will be presented with their trophies at the Annual Presentation dinner.
- B. The overall 72-hole Nett winner will win the NEWBATTLE & KTAG CUPS (Starting handicap to apply)
- C. The 72-hole Nett winner in each Division will receive trophies on the completion of play on the date of the final round.
- D. Daily events will be conducted in 3 Grades on current handicaps as per the schedule above.

(Men's & Ladies)

The 4BBB Match Play Qualifying Round for 2018 will be held on Saturday 14/7/2018. Dates allocated for the Match Play Rounds are specified below. Please mark the top of the score card with a "Q" if you are going to qualify. Cards not marked will be deemed to be "NQ" (non-qualifiers).

It is the PLAYERS RESPONSIBILITY to ensure they are available for these dates as forfeits are not acceptable. To be eligible players must be a financial member of the Caboolture Golf Club and hold a current GA handicap and have paid the starting fee as prescribed by the Match Committee.

CONDITIONS OF PLAY

1. The event will be conducted in accordance within the Rules of Golf and any Local Rules as displayed on the Local Rule Board.
2. PLAYERS are to report to the STARTER 15 minutes prior to their allotted tee time. Failure to do so could result in a penalty imposed by the Match Committee. - Rule No 5.3(a).
3. Men will tee off from the WHITE markers. Ladies will tee off from the RED markers.
4. COMPLETED CARDS must be in the hands of the Match Committee 15 minutes after the completion of the round. Any card not so presented will be considered as an NCR. The Match Committee will not pursue or be held responsible for any such cards. The Match Committee will settle any disputes or protests, which must be in writing and submitted within 15 minutes of the completion of play on the day. Rule 20.2(b).
5. THE BEST 16 NETT OR 8 NETT SCORES will qualify for the 4BBB Match Play Draw.
6. TIES for 16th or 8th position will be decided by the Rules of Golf count back system.
7. All matches are to be played off starting handicaps off the Stroke Index as indicated on the score card. If the match is not completed in 18 holes, then strokes must be given on any further holes played to obtain a result.
8. Handicap allowance for 4BBB Match Play is the full difference between the stroke play handicaps of the players. The lowest marker to concede strokes to the others including his partner. **For Example:** *Player A on a handicap of 10 receives nil, his partner on a handicap of 15 receives 5 strokes, C on a handicap of 18 receives 8 and D on a handicap of 27 receives 17. Players should receive 2 strokes per hole where applicable.*
9. Elimination matches are to be played on or before the programmed dates extensions will not be given. It is the players responsibility to ensure they are available for these matches.
10. Forfeits must not be given unless BOTH players in a team are unable to play
11. Overall winner \$100, Runners up \$60. To be awarded at the Annual Presentation Night.

5. Completed cards must be in the hands of the Match Committee 15 minutes after the completion of the round on the day. FOURSOMES CHAMPIONSHIPS CONDITIONS OF PLAY

MEN'S AND LADIES.

In 2018 the foursomes Championships of Caboolture Golf Club will be held on Saturday the 24th August 2019. To be eligible for the Championships players must be a full financial member prior to the commencement of the event, hold a G.A handicap and have paid the starting fees as determined by the Match Committee.

CONDITIONS OF PLAY

1. The event will be conducted in accordance within the Rules of Golf and any Local Rules of the Caboolture Golf Club.
2. Competitions fees determined by Match Committee.
3. Players are to report to the starter 15 minutes prior to their allotted tee time. Failure to do so could result in a penalty imposed by the Match Committee – Rule No 5.3(a).
4. Any disputes must be submitted in writing to the Match Committee 15 minutes after game. Match Committees decision is final. Rule 20.2(b)
5. Teeing off in 7-minute intervals the men from 6am and then followed by the lady's field at 9am.
6. Men's tee **BLUE**. Ladies tee **RED**.
7. The Championships will be conducted over 36 Hole for the Men and 27 holes for the Ladies. The Men 's competition will be held in 3 Grades; grades will be calculated by adding both handicaps together and halving the total, this number will determine their grade. The Ladies competition will be ALL IN.

MEN A GRADE 0-13 B GRADE 14-19 C GRADE 20-36

LADIES ALL IN 0-45

8. Championship Winners will be the pair in each grade with the lowest gross score.
9. Ties, in each grade including Ladies competition will be decided by a 3-hole playoff (10,11 and 18), if a tie still exists, sudden death from the first tee.
10. Order of play must **ALTERNATE** after 18 holes.
11. Penalty shots do not alter the order of play.
12. Morning cards are to be returned on completion of the morning round and handicaps must be displayed on the afternoon card or disqualification for the Nett event will proceed. Men please mark morning card with AM card.
13. A 20-minute lunch break is compulsory and must be taken after 18 holes.
14. Trophies:
 - a) The Club Champions and runners up will be presented with their trophies at the Annual Presentation Dinner.
 - b) All Nett and Runners up trophy winners will be presented with trophies on the day.

PATRON'S TROPHY & WARARBA SHIELD

In 2018 the **Patron's Trophy & Wararba Shield** qualifying round will be held in conjunction with the Monthly Medal on Saturday 2nd February 2019.

To be eligible, players must be financial members prior to the commencement of the event, hold a current GA handicap and have paid the starting fee as prescribed by the Match Committee.

CONDITIONS OF PLAY

1. THE EVENTS will be conducted in accordance within the Rules of Golf and any Local Rules of Caboolture Golf Club.
2. Visitors to the club can play in the event but are not eligible to qualify for the Patrons Trophy or the Wararba.Shield. Also, cannot win the Monthly Medal Nett events.
3. PLAYERS are to report to the **STARTER** 15 minutes prior to their allotted tee time. Failure to do so could result in a penalty imposed by the MATCH committee (Rule No 5.3(a)).
4. ALL PLAYERS are to indicate their intentions to the starter prior to the qualifying round if they are unavailable for the Match Play dates indicated below. Please place a "Q" or "NQ" on the top RHS of your score card if you cannot compete on the dates indicated below: -

5. COMPLETED CARDS must be in the hands of the Match Committee or their representative's 15 minutes after the completion of the round of golf. Any card not so presented will be considered as NCR. The Match Committee will not pursue or be held responsible for any such cards not presented.
6. THE BEST SIXTEEN (16) nett scores will qualify for the single match play. Any ties for the sixteenth position will be decided by the GA count back system. The number of strokes awarded in this competition is the difference between the player's stroke handicaps. Where there is more than eighteen (18) strokes the difference between player's handicaps, players shall receive 2 strokes per hole where applicable. Each match must be played to a conclusion. The Ladies match play will be decided by the Match Committee on the day by the numbers playing.
7. All matches are to be played off starting handicaps off the Match Play Index as indicated on the score card. If the match is not completed in 18 holes, then strokes must be given on any further holes played to obtain a result.
8. THE PATRON'S TROPHY and THE WARARBA SHIELD runners up will be presented with their trophies at the Annual Presentation Dinner.

The presidents Trophy is a 36 Hole Single Stableford Event that is held over 2 consecutive Saturdays. Dates are set by the Match Committee. The lowest combined Nett score from both rounds will determine the winner.

CONDITIONS OF PLAY.

1. This event will be conducted in accordance with the Rules of Golf and any Local Rules as displayed on the Local Rules board.
2. To be eligible to play this competition players must be full financial members of the Caboolture Golf Club, a visitor with proof of membership of another club or a member of a Social Group with a current G.A handicap.
3. Set Competition fees apply. Daily prize distribution as per guidelines. Visitors competition fees will vary. Visitors are not eligible to win the Presidents Trophy they however can win runners up, NTP and ball rundown.
4. Players are to report to the Starter 15 minutes prior to their allotted tee time. Failure to do so could result in a penalty imposed by the Match Committee. Rule 5.3(a)
5. Cards must be completed and in the hands of the Match Committee 15 minutes after the completion of the round of golf on the day of play and any card not presented will be considered an NCR. The Match Committee will not pursue or be held responsible for any such cards.

CONDITIONS OF PLAY

2. **PLAYERS** are to report to the **STARTER** 15 minutes prior to their allotted tee time. Failure to do so could result in a penalty imposed by the MATCH committee. Rule 5.3(a)
3. Men will tee off from the **BLUE** tee. Ladies will tee off from the **RED** tee.
4. **CARDS** must be in the hands of the Match Committee prior to presentation on the day of play and any card not so presented will be considered as NCR. The Match Committee will not pursue or be held responsible for any such cards.
5. **THE CHAMPIONSHIPS** will be conducted over 27 holes of Foursomes Stroke Play in an open division. The Championship Winners will be the players with the lowest gross score.
6. **PLAY-OFF** for ties will be decided by a 3-hole aggregate playoff on holes 10, 11 & 18 and then sudden death if still tied from the first tee.
7. **ORDER OF PLAY: 1st 18 holes:** Gentlemen to tee-off the odd numbered holes and ladies to tee-off even numbered holes, alternating for the **3rd 9 holes** with the ladies to tee-off the odd numbered holes and the gentlemen to tee-off the even numbered holes.
8. **TROPHIES**
 - a. The Club Champions and Runners Up will be presented with trophies at the Annual Presentation dinner.
 - b. The 27-hole Nett and Runners Up, 18-hole Nett & 9-hole Nett winners will be presented with trophies on the day.

MONTHLY MEDAL AND MEDAL OF MEDALS

The Caboolture Golf Club Monthly Medal Competition will be played throughout the Year. The competition will be held as an 18-hole Stroke event. Medal dates will be as specified in the Yearly Fixtures Book for both the Men and the Ladies. All winning Nett Players in their Grade will be eligible to play in the Medal of Medals game held each November in conjunction with the November Monthly Medal. Medal of Medals Date 2nd November 2019. To be eligible to win a Monthly Medal or the Medal of Medals the Player must be a full financial member of the Caboolture Golf Club and hold a current G.A handicap.

Medal of Medals is a Nett event. All players who win their Nett division throughout the year will be eligible to compete in the Medal of Medals. The Men and Ladies are in an All-In Nett event for the winner who will then be put on the Honour Board.

CONDITIONS OF PLAY.

1. The event will be conducted in accordance within the Rules of Golf and any Local Rules as displayed on the Local Rules board outside the Proshop on the day of play.
2. Normal Competition Fees apply.
3. Players are to report to the Starter 15 minutes prior to their allotted tee time. Failure to do so could result in a penalty imposed by the Match Committee. Rule 5.3(a).
4. All men's Medal days will be held on Saturdays. Ladies Medal days will be split between Thursday and Saturday dates each month.
5. Men tee **BLUE**. Ladies tee **RED**.
6. Ball rundown will be graded and calculated on the number of players in each grade.
7. Cards must be completed and in the hands of the Match Committee 15 minutes after the completion of the round of golf on the day of play and any card not presented will be considered an NCR. The Match Committee will not pursue or be held responsible for any such cards.
8. Any disputes in any of the games must be put in writing and presented to the Match Committee no more than 15 minutes after the completion of the game. Rule 20.2(b).
9. Handicaps for the event will be:

10. Throughout the year every winner of the Nett event will be eligible to play in the Medal of Medals- Honour Board Event, that will be held in conjunction with the November Medal event. There will be no specific seeded draw for the finalist, a list of Players will be placed on the notice boards throughout the club, each Player is responsible for the checking for their own eligibility.
11. Ties: in the event of a tie in the Nett Competition of Medal of Medals a Playoff of a full 18-hole competition will occur the following week (Saturday). This applies to both the Men's Competition and the Ladies Competition.
12. All daily prizes are as per trophy distribution guidelines. Each Grade will have a best Gross Winner.

13. Visitors are welcome to play in the Monthly Medal; however, they are not eligible to WIN the daily Nett prize therefore cannot play in the Medal of Medals. Visitors can be runners up, Gross winner, NTP and Ball Rundown.

PRIZES: The Men's and Ladies Yearly Medal of Medals Winner and Runners Up will be presented at the Annual Presentation Night.

The Prize payout for the Winner \$100 and Runners up \$60 to be paid at the end of year.

CONDITIONS OF PLAY

1. The event will be conducted in accordance within the Rules of Golf and any Local Rules as displayed on the local rule board outside the Pro-Shop on the day of play.
2. Ties for 16th or 8th position will be decided by play-offs and if still tied by the GA count back system.
3. Any withdrawals become automatic forfeits.
4. Completed cards must be in the hand of the Match Committee 15 minutes after completion of the round. Any card not so presented will be considered as an NCR. The Match Committee will not pursue or be held responsible for any such cards. The Match Committee will settle any disputes or protests which must be in writing and submitted within 15 minutes of the completion of play on the day. Rule 20.2(a).
5. Match Play is half of the difference between the aggregate stroke play handicaps on both sides. Example: - A's handicap is 15 & B's is 4, their total is 19. Their opponent's C's & D's handicaps are 30 & 14 respectively, a total of 44. The difference is 25 and half of 25 is 12½ or 13 strokes which is the allowance C & D receive in match play.
6. Should the course be unplayable, the ladies Match Committee will specify new dates.
7. Trophies for this event will be presented at the minor ladies' presentation at the end of the year. Prizes for this event are Donated.
8. Any exception to the Semi Finals or Finals will be decided by ladies Match.

VETERANS CHAMPIONSHIPS

CONDITIONS OF PLAY

1. The championship shall consist of 2 stroke rounds of 18 holes played on consecutive Tuesdays.

8. Players retain their starting handicap for aggregate Nett trophies, but any reduction in the first round is applicable for the Nett score for the second round.
9. Daily Nett trophies will be awarded to the Best Ladies and Men's winner and runner up.
10. Should the course be unplayable, the Match Committee will specify new dates.
11. Putting competition is the lowest combined number of putts over the 2 rounds.

CABOOLTURE WEEKLY STABLEFORD MEDLEY COMPETITION

CONDITIONS OF PLAY

The Caboolture Weekly Stableford Competition is an 18-hole competition that can be played at any day of the week, starting Monday morning and each weekly competition to be finalised each Sunday afternoon. However, this competition CANNOT be played in conjunction with any other weekly Members competition. Times for playing will depend on available social time slots on the booking sheet, with the exception being Sunday afternoons Stableford will be incorporated with this competition.

Each Member/Visitor that enters the competition can play as many times as they like in the week. Competition Fees apply each time an individual Member/Visitor plays.

CONDITIONS OF PLAY

1. The event will be conducted in accordance with the Rules of Golf and any Local Rules on the Local Rules Board.
2. The competition can be played from opening of the course Monday to Sunday.
3. Normal competition Fees apply.
4. All players must check in through Pro Shop.
5. Competition cards to be handed into the Pro Shop after each round on the day of play.
6. All Competition cards to be collated and submitted by 5pm Sunday.
7. To be eligible to play, the player must be a financial member of the Caboolture Golf Club or a Visitor from another club with a current G.A handicap.
8. All cards submitted by players will be Handicapped, however only a competitor's highest stableford score will be submitted into the final competition.
9. Each player can only win one major prize.
10. The prize payout for the completed competition will be a percentage of collected competition fees and paid in points for 1st, 2nd, 3rd and 4th prizes in 1 Division.
11. No Ball Rundown or Nearest to the Pins will be set for the competition, however, each week a Birdie Box will be picked on one specific hole. Each player achieving a birdie on this hole are to be paid 500 points for their achievement. Each player will be subject to the changing daily conditions of that particular hole (e.g.: pin placement and tee markers will be moved as usual).
12. Hole in Ones and Eagles will be recognised under normal Competition Conditions.
13. Any disputes will be resolved by Match Committee or the Pro on duty on the day of play.
14. A minimum of 2 Members/Visitors with a G.A H'Cap must be in each group.
15. Members/Visitors with a G.A H'Cap are responsible for marking their opponent's cards.
16. Competition cards marked by social players will be disqualified.
17. Members/Visitors with a G.A H'Cap playing in the Friday Meat Muster are eligible to play in the Weekly Competition in a combined event, on payment of the extra competition fee (e.g. Meat Muster \$7 plus Weekly Comp \$14 total fee for the 2 Competitions \$21).

2 (TWO) tee shots per player – initialled beside score
Preferred lie of one card length through the green

Throughout the year Caboolture Golf Club has a wide selection of Individual, team and partners events, for all ages, Men, Ladies and Juniors.

CONDITIONS OF PLAY

1. These events will be conducted in accordance with the Rules of Golf and any Local Rules as displayed on the Local Rules board.
2. To be eligible to play these competitions players must be full financial members of the Caboolture Golf Club, a visitor with proof of membership of another club or a member of a Social Group with a current G.A handicap.
3. Set Competition fees apply. Prize distribution as per guidelines. Visitors competition fees will vary.
4. Players are to report to the Starter 15 minutes prior to their allotted tee time. Failure to do so could result in a penalty imposed by the Match Committee.
5. Cards must be completed and in the hands of the Match Committee 15 minutes after the completion of the round of golf on the day of play and any card not presented will be considered an NCR. The Match Committee will not pursue or be held responsible for any such cards.
6. Any disputes in any of the games must be put in writing and presented to the Match Committee no more than 15 minutes after the completion of the game. Rule 20.2(b).

GAMES THAT CLASS AS SPECIAL EVENTS – HOW TO PLAY.

FOURBALL EVENT: Swingers will no longer be permitted. The original pair will remain a team while any single players will be teamed with the next single player on the time sheet (starters responsibility). The Match Committee will collate any single scores into the fourball format on the return of cards. If the number of single players is uneven then the last player will be teamed with the lowest marker of the previous single players

IRISH FOURBALL: Played in a team of 4 in a stableford format. The 2 best scores are recorded from holes 1 through 6. The best 3 scores are recorded from holes 7 through 12 and the best 4 scores are recorded from holes 13 to 18. If only 3 players are in the team then all 3 scores are recorded for all 18 holes. All scores must have the initial of the player noted.

CHAPMAN FOURSOMES: Half combined stroke handicap. Each player plays from the tee and plays the next shot with their own ball. The players then decide the ball to be played, and this ball is then played alternately for the remainder of the hole.

LONE RANGER: Single stroke format in teams of 4 where each player is numbered in any order 1 to 4. No 1 player is the lone ranger on the 1st hole and their score must count with the best score of the other 3 players in the group. The No 2 player is the lone ranger on the 2nd hole and their score must count with the best score of the other 3 players in the group etc. Remember if you start on the 10th then the no 2 player in the group is the lone ranger.

PAR BISQUE: Full handicap strokes are to be used on the holes of the players choice with number of strokes used on each hole unlimited until all used up. No allowances for unused shots.

CANADIAN FOURSOMES: Half combined stroke handicap. Both play from the tee and then decide on which ball is to be played. The ball is then played alternately for the remainder of the hole.

AMERICAN FOURSOMES: Half combined stroke handicap. Both players play from the tee and then play one shot with their partners ball. The players then decide which ball is to be played, and this ball is played alternately for the remainder of the hole.

AMBROSE: Players in teams of 2,3 or 4. Handicaps are calculated by adding those of all players and divide the total by: 4 in a 2-ball event, 6 in a 3-ball event, and 8 in a 4-ball event. The card is marked as of a single stroke round with nett scores calculated by subtracting the exact resulting handicap. The lowest marker becomes team captain. Each player must record their handicap on the scorecard and the card must be countersigned by another member of the team on completion of the game and before it is returned. On the green first player may putt out (other players only putt when it is possible to better the existing score). Preferred lie of one card length through the green and in the bunkers, to apply for all Ambrose events.

- 4-person Ambrose requires a minimum 4 tee shots per player.
- 3-person Ambrose requires a minimum 5 tee shots per player.
- 2-person Ambrose requires a minimum 6 tee shots per player.

CAPTAIN AMBROSE: Played in teams of 4. All 4 players hit off the tee, and then the team captain (lowest marker) selects the ball to be played. All players except the owner of the selected ball play the next shot from this position. This process continues until the ball is holed (i.e. the owner of the selected ball does not play the shot). Handicaps are calculated by adding those of all players and dividing the total

by 8. The card is marked as a single stroke round with Nett scores calculated by subtracting exact resulting handicaps. Each player must record their handicap on the scorecard and the card must be countersigned by another member of the team on completion of the game and before it is returned. Each player (excepted the owner of the selected ball) must putt out except when it is not possible to better the existing score.

STABLEFORD TEAMS EVENTS: Played in a team of 3 or 4 as a single stableford. The best score of the team is then recorded on the card and initialled.

SINGLE STABLEFORD: Stableford involves scoring points based on results at each hole. Using the index for each hole, players can make a mental allocation of their full handicap for each of the 18 holes. For example, a player on a handicap of 18 will add one shot to the par value of each hole to determine their own par for the hole. Thus a hole rated as a par 4 becomes a par 5 for the player.

The points scoring method is then calculated by allocating two points for a par, one point for one over, three points for one under, four points for two under, and so on. For example, a player receiving a stroke on a par 4-hole scores 4 giving them a net 3; for this the player receives 3 points. A player at a par 3-hole scores a 4 but does not receive a stroke; for this the player would receive 1 point.

Players who exceed their own par by two strokes score no points for the hole and, since they cannot improve on that result, they should pick up their ball. At the end of the round all points scored are added up and the player having the highest number of points is the winner.

When marking the score card, the number of strokes taken must always be shown for holes where points are scored. Thus, the card records both strokes and points.

STROKE ROUND: Stroke (Medal) The score at each hole is entered on the score card, totalled and the player's full handicap deducted. The player who completes the stipulated round in the fewest net strokes is the winner. Usually a gross winner is also determined.
