## Club Rules

## DRESS REQUIREMENTS

The standards of our Golf Club are judged by the dress standards of our members and visitors. These standards are set for the betterment of the Club, and it would be appreciated if you and your guests adhere to these rules. Smart casual attire for the Club House.
Dress requirements for Golf Course is shirts must have collars or golf shirt, turtleneck shirts acceptable with sporting logo.
NOT ACCEPTABLE: Board shorts, swim shorts, football shorts and socks. Tee shirts either plain or adorned with bawdy slogans are not permitted.
FOOTWEAR (MEN \& WOMEN): Fully enclosed or leather sandals are acceptable.

## MEMBERS INFORMATION

It is the responsibility of all members to keep their contact information up to date. Please notify the club if your address, phone number or email details change as soon as possible.

## VISITORS

Visitors are always welcome at our club, all guests must adhere to the rules and conditions as set by the club. Any member who brings a visitor to the club or course will be responsible for that visitor.

## COMPLAINTS

All complaints must be in writing and submitted to management. A form is available at the Pro-shop to help in the processing of any legitimate complaint. By putting your complaint in writing you are committing to the complaint and will also see that the relevant response is given by the appropriate person.

## CLUB STAFF

Staff are here to enhance the golfing experience and to ensure everyone has a fulfilling time playing the game we love. Under no circumstances shall club staff be reprimanded by members or visitors. Any negative behaviour will lead to action from the Board of Directors.

## COMMITTEE MEMBERS AND VOLUNTEERS

Remember our committee members are volunteers, under no circumstances will any committee member or volunteer be reprimanded by members or visitors. Any negative behaviour will lead to action at a board level.

Remember your Board Members and Committee Members are members too. Please bring your issues to them AFTER they have completed their game.

Honesty, integrity, and courtesy: 3 words that represent the spirit in which the game of golf is played. Quote: 'The R\&A'

## Club Rules of Golf

## STARTING TIME

The Pro-shop and Match Committee have complete control of the time sheet of the day, and may alter any players, groups or starting tee before commencement of play.
All players must report to the Pro-shop 15 minutes before their tee time. All players are reminded of Rule 5.3a, any player arriving more than 5 minutes early or late for their tee time will face disqualification. The maximum number of players allowed in each group is 4 this group number is not negotiable.

## HANDICAPPING

At the completion of each day's competition all players scores will be uploaded for handicapping, any concerns, or questions about a member's handicap, please approach the Match Director or Club Professional.
Any new member who does not have a handicap must submit 3 rounds of 18 holes for submission to attain a handicap. It is preferable that these rounds be played with an existing member.

## COMPETITIONS

It is the responsibility of each player to be familiar with the Condition of Play for each competition.
To be eligible to play in any club competition the player must be a financial member and hold a current G.A. handicap. A minimum of 16 players is required to constitute a competition, if there are less than 16 players, the Match

Committee have the authority to calculate any prize payouts for the competition or cancel the days competition. Less than 4 players and the competition is cancelled.

## COMPLETED CARDS/MISCORE APP

All competition cards must be in the hands of the Match Committee 15 minutes after the completion of the round. Either in the box provided or handed to a Match Committee member. Any card not so presented will be considered a NSNA (No Score Not Approved). The Match Committee will not pursue or be held responsible for any such cards. Any disputes must be in writing and submitted withing 15 minutes after completion of play on the day, a complaint form is available in the Proshop.
MISCORE APP SCORING: It is the responsibility of the individual player or team to ensure another player in the group is correctly marking their score with the App and therefore submitting it correctly within 15 minutes after the completion of the game. All cards or APP submissions must be in be 5:30pm, close of competition.

## LOCAL RULES

A full version of the Local Rules is printed on the board outside the Proshop and is also downloaded to the Caboolture Golf Club App \& MiScore App, under Local Rules. Temporary rules are also located outside the Pro-shop.
It is the responsibility of all players to be familiar with these rules before every game. I didn't know is no excuse.

## RULES OF GOLF

The Match Committee encourages all members to be aware of the rules. Please carry a copy of the Rule of Golf 2023 edition with you or download the R\&A App from your App Store onto your device or mobile phone. The Rules of Golf is also available through the MiScore App - go to MENU.

## ETIQUETTE AND CONSIDERATION FOR OTHERS

The lowest marker in a group is responsible for the conduct of his/her fellow players. Offensive language will not be tolerated either in the Club House or surrounds, offenders may be asked to leave. The destruction of club or course property will result in action by the Board of Directors. Be patient, tactful and pleasant, the Match Committee recommend all players be aware of Rules 1-4 in the 2023 edition of Rules of Golf - The Fundamentals of the Game.

Penalties can now be applied if etiquette rules are disregarded or ignored No one should move, talk, or stand close to or directly behind the ball or the hole when a player is addressing a ball or making a stroke. No player should hit until the players in front are out of range.
PACE OF PLAY: Slow play is distracting. "Keep up with the group in front, don't keep in front of the group behind". Competition cards have a recommended time printed on each hole it shows when your group should be at the tee on each hole, 4 hours and 20 minutes is the allocated time for each game. Be aware of your position in the field and remember your position affects other players. Slow Play Penalties are, first a verbal warning and if it then becomes necessary for the marshal to return to that group a General Penalty ( 2 strokes) will be added to the round of all players involved.
READY GOLF: Ready golf is preferred. Don't delay if a ball is lost, remember the Rules of Golf give 3 minutes to find a ball. Not 3 minutes per player in the group. Be mindful of your place in the field. When the play of a hole has been completed, players should immediately leave the putting green. Cards are to be marked before leaving the next tee.
INFRINGEMENTS: It is the duty of every member to bring to the notice of the Committee any infringements of the Rules and the Etiquette of Golf.
MOBILE PHONES: The use of a mobile phone by a competitor whilst on the golf course during an event is distracting and inconsiderate. Please turn the volume down or the phone off. They are a measuring device, for the use of the MiScore APP or a Rule guide reference only.

## SAFETY

Calling FORE is important for the safety of all players anywhere on the course. The 15th hole is an area where it is always recommended "fore" be called when teeing off the 15th tee. During the week Green Staff have right of way anywhere on the course.

## SUSPENSION OF PLAY

LIGHTING STORMS OR POOR LIGHT: If conditions on the course become dangerous the Pro-shop or Match Committee will give the following signals - 1 Long Horn Blow - Evacuate course immediately. Rule 5.7b/1 Multiple Short Horn Blows - Normal suspension. Rule 5.7b/2 All players are to report to club house. Play will resume at a time when it is deemed safe to do so. If play cannot be resumed players who don't finish their game will be recorded as a NSA* (No
score - approved). Any players who do not wish to continue with their game must notify the Match Committee or Pro-shop before leaving the club.
EXTREME HEAT POLICY: On competition days where the outside temperature exceeds 37 degrees Celsius, Multiple Short Horn Blows will sound, this will give players the option to NSA* (No score - approved) their game due to extreme heat. Players will not be given the choice to postpone their game in the heat, they must make the decision to either play on or quit for the day. The individual player is responsible for their own actions. *NSA is not a disqualification. All players are to report to club house before leaving.

## CARE OF THE COURSE

There are 5 areas of every golf course, and it is all our responsibility to look after them all. The Rules of Golf state you are to play your ball as it lies, however it is important to remember every player has a responsibility to care for the course and return it to its original condition wherever possible. Always leave any area of the course in good condition for the next group.
BUNKERS: Before leaving a bunker, a player must carefully rake up all holes made by him/her therein, these include shoe prints and divots. Leave the rake with the handle placed in line with the direction of play.
DIVOTS: Through the green a player should ensure that any divots are correctly filled in with either sand or the turf cut out or displaced when making the stroke. Always carry and use sand buckets every time you play
PITCH MARKS ON THE GREEN: Every player has a responsibility to carry a pitch repair tool. Any damage to the putting surface such as plugs, or spike marks made by any player MUST be carefully repaired. FLAGSTICK: Always make sure the flagstick is correctly placed back in the hole when your group has finished the hole.

## MOTORISED AND PUSH CARTS

Push carts may be walked carefully across the green; however, players are asked to be mindful of their actions. Motorised carts, electric or petrol, MUST NOT be taken within 10 meters of any green or bunker, this includes the practice putting and chipping greens.

## CLUB COMPETITIONS

## Honour Board Events

To be eligible to win or come runner up in Honour Board Events at the Caboolture Golf Club, players must be Full Financial Members (Ordinary Members, Life Members, Juniors, and Intermediate Members) for the duration of the event and have a current G.A. handicap. All players must have submitted a minimum of 5 competition cards at the Caboolture Golf Club in the previous 12 months prior to the commencement of the event to be eligible.

## THE EASTER CUP

The Easter Cup is an 'All in' Best Nett score competition for the Men and the Women. Played on Saturday the $30^{\text {th }}$ March 2024. Once the game is completed any ties for the winner for both men and women will be determined on the count back system.

## CLUB CHAMPIONSHIP

The Club Championships are held in 3 Grades and includes Men's, Women's, Seniors and Juniors. It is 72 holes of stroke play, 4 daily rounds of 18 holes. A seeded draw will be held in the 3rd and 4th rounds. Condition of Play for the event will be posted 2 weeks in advance. After the final round the eight (8) top ranked Men players in each grade will then go into the draw to play the Men's Matchplay Championships.

## MEN'S MATCHPLAY CHAMPIONSHIP

The top 8 men in each grade will play under Matchplay conditions until the Matchplay Champions are decided. Match's will be graded and held without the benefit of Handicap. Any changes needed to the Matchplay format is up to the discretion of the Match Committee. Games will be played on or before the $7^{\text {th }}$, $14^{\text {th }} \& 21^{\text {st }}$ September 2024.

## 4BBB MATCHPLAY CHAMPIONSHIP

After the completion of the 4BBB Stroke Qualifier, the top 16 lowest Nett qualifiers of Men and top 8 Women will then go into the draw to play 4BBB Matchplay until there is a winner. The qualifier is the $29^{\text {th }}$ June 2024, the rounds are held on the $13^{\text {th }}, 20^{\text {th }}, 27^{\text {th }}$ July $\& 3^{\text {rd }}$ August 2024

## MEN'S AND WOMEN'S FOURSOMES CHAMPIONSHIP

Played all in one day, Men and Women's' championship is 27 holes played in a graded competition for the men and ALL IN for the Women's. Overall Best Gross declared the Honour Board winners. Played on the $22^{\text {nd }}$ June 2024.

## MIXED FOURSOMES' CHAMPIONSHIP

Played all in one day in mixed pairs over 18 holes, shot gun start. The Best Gross score is the winner. Played on the $14^{\text {th }}$ April 2024.

## MEDAL OF MEDALS

Played on $12^{\text {th }}$ October 2024, all men and women members who have won a Monthly Medal in their grade throughout the year qualify to play in the Medal of Medals. The Medal of Medals is a Men's and Women's Nett based competition. All players who qualify for the Medal of Medals will play a stroke round not stableford.
The Men's Monthly Medals will be played 12 times (one each month) and will be played in 3 Grades, $+6-12 ; 13-18 ; 19-36$. The men's qualifying rounds will be from October to September.
The Women's Monthly Medal will be played 8 times in the year, the season will be from February to September. All players will play stroke. The Women's Grades are - 0-20; 21-29; 30-45. In the event of any ties in any Monthly Medal or the daily event, the winning score will be determined by the GA countback system. Any ties for the Medal of Medals will be determined by the normal countback system.

## HOLE IN ONES

All members who achieve a Hole in One will be included each year on the Honour Board for this category.

## WARARBA SHIELD

The Wararba Shield is a Single Matchplay event only for Women members. The Qualifying round is a single stroke play round on the $4^{\text {th }}$ May 2024. The top eight (8) Women will then go into the draw and play handicap Matchplay until one winner and runner-up are determined. Round Dates are $1^{\text {st }}, 8^{\text {th }}, 15^{\text {th }}$ June 2024.

## MAJOR COMPETITIONS

To be eligible to win in Major Events at the Caboolture Golf Club, players must be Full Financial Members (OR, LI, JR, or IT) for the duration of the event and have a current GA handicap. All players must have submitted a minimum of 5 competition cards at the Caboolture Golf Club in the previous 12 months prior to the commencement of the event to be eligible. The exception is the Wednesday Challenge Final

## NEWBATTLE CUP

The Newbattle Cup is played during the Men's Championships and is the best aggregate Nett, on starting handicap, over the 72 holes. George and Karren Goodall are the donor of this trophy. The Winner will also receive a dedicated parking space for the year.

## KTAG CUP

The KTAG Cup is played during the Women's Championships and is the best aggregate Nett, on starting handicap, over the 72 holes. George and Karren Goodall are the donor of this trophy. The Winner will also receive a dedicated parking space for the year.

## THE PRESIDENTS SHIELD

The Presidents Shield is a competition for men only played in 2 rounds on the $13^{\text {th }}, 20^{\text {th }}$ April 2024. It is an All in stableford competition, the winner is the member with the highest combined stableford score for the two rounds.

## SHORT COURSE CHAMPIONSHIP

The Men's Short Course Championship is a stroke competition and will be played on the $16^{\text {th }}$ November 2024. Awards will be given for Best Overall Gross and Nett. The Women's Short Course Championship is a stroke competition played on the $16^{\text {th }}$ November 2024. Best Overall Nett declared the Winner.

## VETERANS CHAMPIONSHIP

The Seniors and Veterans Championship will consist of two (2) stroke rounds of 18 holes played over two (2) consecutive Tuesdays. Prizes for the competition are 36 -hole Nett and 36 -hole Gross for the Men and Women. A Men's and Women's putting competition is included in this championship. Rounds will be played on the $18^{\text {th }} \& 25^{\text {th }}$ June 2024

## WEDNESDAY CHALLENGE

Played in a stroke round on the 3rd Wednesday of each Month. To qualify for the final, a player must come 1st or 2nd in their division or win Best Gross, all qualifiers will be based on the GA countback system. The season starts in July and ends in June each year. The final will be played the $17^{\text {th }}$ July 2024

## PATRONS TROPHY

The 'Patrons Trophy' is a Men's Single Matchplay competition. The qualifying round will be played in conjunction with the Men's February Monthly Medal on $3^{\text {rd }}$ February 2024 the top sixteen (16) Men will then go into the draw and play handicap Matchplay until one winner and runner-up are determined. Round Dates are $10^{\text {th }}, 17^{\text {th }}, 24^{\text {th }}$ February 2024 \& $9^{\text {th }}$ March 2024. Event sponsored by Greg Chippendale.

## CABOOLTURE CUP

The Caboolture Cup is a men's ALL IN Order of Merit competition for all the male Full Financial Members (Ordinary Members, Life Members, Juniors, and Intermediate Members) of the Caboolture Golf Club. The race will commence on the $3^{\text {rd }}$ February 2024 and conclude on the $2^{\text {nd }}$ November 2024. Every Saturday in this season all men's single events will go towards the Order of Merit.

## COMPETITION INFORMATION

## MEN'S' ECLECTIC

All Members will be automatically included in the Eclectic competition that will only be conducted on Monthly Medal Days (12) from January to December. Competition results are Graded and based on half the player's current daily handicap.

## WOMEN'S ECLECTIC

All single rounds only played on Thursday and Saturday, Running from January, to November. On the final day of this competition, half current handicap will be deducted from the total 18 -hole scores to determine winners and runner-up. Competition is Graded.

## SENIOR/VETERANS ECLECTIC

All single rounds only played on Tuesdays, commencing on $16^{\text {th }}$ January 2024, and finishing on $3^{\text {rd }}$ December 2024. On the final day of the competition, half current handicap will be deducted from the total 18-hole score. Both Men's and Women's competition will be ALL IN. Presentation of winners will be held at the Seniors/veterans GALA Day.

## EAGLES NEST

(Members Only) All eagles recorded will receive 25\% of the pool of the day. There will be no payouts on Orange Short Course, Mens Red Tee Challenge, Ambrose or Foursomes events.

## SILVER CIRCLE

(Members Only) A silver circle is any NTP 45cm or less (on par 3's). All NTP's recorded will receive $20 \%$ of the pool of the day and if there is two or more on any hole then the nearest measurement will receive the 'NTP' ball allocation as well.

## FOURSOMES (Including Mixed)

Half combined stroke handicap. Players play alternatively from the tee and alternate shots for the remainder of each hole. Penalty shots do not alter the order of play.

## CHAPMAN FOURSOMES

Half combined stroke handicap. Each player plays from the tee and plays the next shot with their own ball. The players then decide the ball to be played, and this ball is then played alternately for the remainder of the hole.

## CANADIAN FOURSOMES

Half combined stroke handicap. Both play from the tee and decide on which ball is to be played. The ball is then played alternately for the remainder of the hole.

## AMERICAN FOURSOMES

Half combined stroke handicap. Both players play from the tee, and then play one shot with their partner's ball. The players then decide which ball is to be played, and this ball is then played alternately for the remainder of the hole.

## STABLEFORD TEAMS EVENT

Played in a team of three or four as a single stableford. The best score of the team is then recorded on the card.

## FOURBALL EVENTS

Swingers will no longer be permitted. The original pair will remain as a team while any single players will be teamed with the next single player on the time sheet (starter's responsibility). The Match Committee will collate all single scores into the four-ball format on the return of cards. If the number of single players is uneven then the last player will be teamed with the lowest marker of the previous single players.

## IRISH FOURBALL

Played in a team of four in a stableford format. The two (2) best scores are recorded from holes 1 through 6; the best three (3) scores are recorded from holes 7 through 12 and the best four (4) scores are recorded from holes 13 to 18. If only 3 players are in the Page | 25 team, then all three (3) scores are recorded for all 18 holes. All scores must have the initial of the player noted.

## LONE RANGER

Single Stroke format in teams of four (4) where each player is numbered in any order 1 to 4. No. 1 player is the Lone Ranger on the 1st hole and his/her score
must count with the best score of the other 3 players in the group. No. 2 player is the Lone Ranger on the 2nd hole and his/her score must count with the best score of the other 3 players in the group etc. Remember if you start on the 10th tee then the No. 2 player in the group is the Lone Ranger.

## PAR BISQUE

Full handicap strokes are to be used on holes of player's choice with number of strokes used for each hole unlimited until all used. No allowance for unused shots.

## AMBROSE

Played in teams of two, three or four. Handicaps are calculated by adding those of all players and dividing the total by 4 in a two-ball event; 6 in a three-ball event; and 8 in a four-ball event. The card is marked as for a single stroke round with nett scores calculated by subtracting exact resulting handicaps. The lowest marker becomes team captain. Each player must record his/her handicap on the scorecard and the card must be countersigned by another member of the team on completion of the game and before it is returned. On the green first player may putt out (other players putt only when it is possible to better the existing score).

## Preferred lie of one club length through the green and club length in bunkers and one card length on the green. This applies for all Ambrose events.

## 4 Person Ambrose requires minimum 4 Tee Shots per player <br> 3 Person Ambrose requires minimum 5 Tee Shots per player <br> 2 Person Ambrose requires minimum 6 Tee Shots per player

## CAPTAIN'S AMBROSE

Played in teams of four (4). All 4 players hit off the tee, and then the team captain (lowest marker) selects the ball to be played. All players except the owner of the selected ball play the next shot from this position. This process continues until the ball is holed (i.e., the owner of the selected ball does not play the shot). Handicaps are calculated by adding those of all players and dividing the total by 8 . The card is marked as for a single stroke round with nett scores calculated by subtracting exact resulting handicaps. Each player must record his/her handicap on the scorecard and the card must be countersigned by another member of the team on completion of the game and before it is
returned. Each player (except the owner of the selected ball) must putt out except when it is not possible to better the existing score.

## GENTSOMES

Played in teams of four (4), each player tees off. From here the players select the best tee shot and all four then play the hole out with their individual ball as a stableford. The best three (3) scores go on the card, and each team must use at least 3 tee shots from each player. The highest team total is declared the winner.

# Scoring 

MISCORE APP

(Preferred Method of Scoring)
The MiScore app provides the benefit of 'live scoring' during competition rounds, access to viewing the 'live leaderboard' and ability to use the GPS settings of the Pin placements to gather accurate distances from ball to flag during the round.
The MiScore app also enables access to local rules, your MiScore statistics, handicap, rules of golf, social play scoring and including GPS distances.

## MISCORE Phone APP - Scenario 1

MISCORE is LIVE SCORING, once started, You Must Continue to Enter Scores after Each Hole

PLAYER A is using the MiScore Phone App.
Player $\mathbf{A}$ is the MARKER and is filling in the PHONE APP scorecard for PLAYER B \& prints a scorecard for player A ta complete.

## PLAYER B

Has no phone and is using a PRINTED paper Scorecard. Player B is the MARKER and is filling in the printed scorecard for PLAYER A

## SCORECARDS

At the club it is important all players know how to successfully mark and scan their card. Remember in a competition it is the players responsibility to provide 18 correct scores ( 1 for each hole) and the markers and players responsibility to add them all up correctly. Any card that is incorrect on submission could see the marker and or the players disqualification. Rule 3.3b

## FILLING OUT YOUR CARD CORRECTLY

1. Fill out the card as per normal in the Player, Result, Marker, and the Result columns.
2. Place a DOT ( ) in the box that corresponds to the GROSS score achieved on the hole.
3. For holes you do not score on put a DOT in the W column. This stands for wipe and will result in 0 points in stableford or a - in Par events.
4. The Player and the Marker sign in the area provided on the front of the card.

## SCORECARD SCANNING

1. Feed your card through the scanner, score side facing out, leading with the signature end first.
2. Check the screen for any marking errors highlighted by a vacant square.
3. Check each 9 and total 18 -hole scores on the kiosk match up to the same score marked on your card.
4. Once the kiosk matches your card exactly, press "Confirm Score" to finalise score submission. 5. Place card in box provided.

## THE OFFICIAL RULES OF GOLF APP

At the club the 'Players Editions of the Rules of Golf' in book form is available from the office or the proshop, however, it is recommended players download the Official R\&A Rules of Golf APP and become familiar with using it.
The APP is available to download from the APP store for free onto your device or mobile phone.
This App works the same way as the book, it allows the user to quickly look up rules, either by reading the relevant rule, looking at the pictures or for quick reference watching short videos that explain some rules in a clearer way.
The App also gives golfers the chance to improve their knowledge on the rules of golf.
The App is like the book, sections include the 24 rules listed, the definitions needed to understand the rules better, a visual search to allow you to explore the rules in an easier way, essential videos everyone should watch and when you are feeling confident 3 levels of quizzes to challenge your knowledge.
The Rules of Golf is also available on the MiScore App through Menu in the top right corner of the screen.
